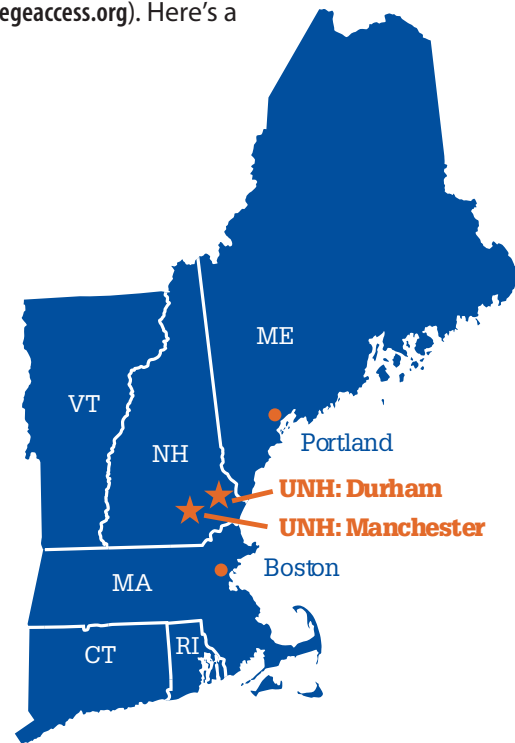

How to apply

For transfer students coming from two- or four-year institutions or community colleges outside New Hampshire, a complete application will include:

- The Common Application (commonapp.org/transferapp), or
- The Coalition Application (coalitionforcollegeaccess.org)
- Application fee (\$50 NH residents/\$65 non-residents) or fee waiver request
- Official high school transcript or GED results
- Official college transcripts
- Optional: SAT scores and recommendations

NH community college students can apply via the NH Transfer Connections Program by using the NH Transfer Form at nhtransfer.org or available from your school’s transfer counselor. There is no application fee.

Service members, veterans and non-traditional students can apply using the UNH transfer form found on our website: admissions.unh.edu/apply/non-traditional-students.

Transfer admissions criteria

UNH considers your academic history, personal experiences, trend in achievement and high school and college course selection as it relates to your intended major. Most admitted transfer students have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or above. Some majors require additional criteria.

Transfer credit evaluation

UNH conducts an official credit evaluation for elective and core classes when you apply. When you enroll, your academic department will determine which transfer courses fulfill requirements for your major. Students can use our UNH Transfer Database (unh.edu/registrar/grades-transcripts/transfer-credit-database.html) to view how courses at other institutions have transferred into the University of New Hampshire.

Scholarships and financial aid

UNH transfer scholarships of up to \$5,000 are available to qualified applicants from associate degree programs or four-year colleges and universities. Transfer students are eligible to receive need-based financial aid (FAFSA required).

Transfer housing

Durham transfer students live off campus and on campus, including in transfer-themed undergraduate apartments. (Submit a campus-housing request as soon as possible after you apply at unh.edu/housing/transfer). We’ll also help you locate off-campus housing and connect to campus: unh.edu/housing/off-campus.

UNH Manchester now offers on-campus housing that is just a short walk to your classes and only steps from downtown Manchester’s vibrant restaurants, shops and nightlife: manchester.unh.edu/housing-dining
